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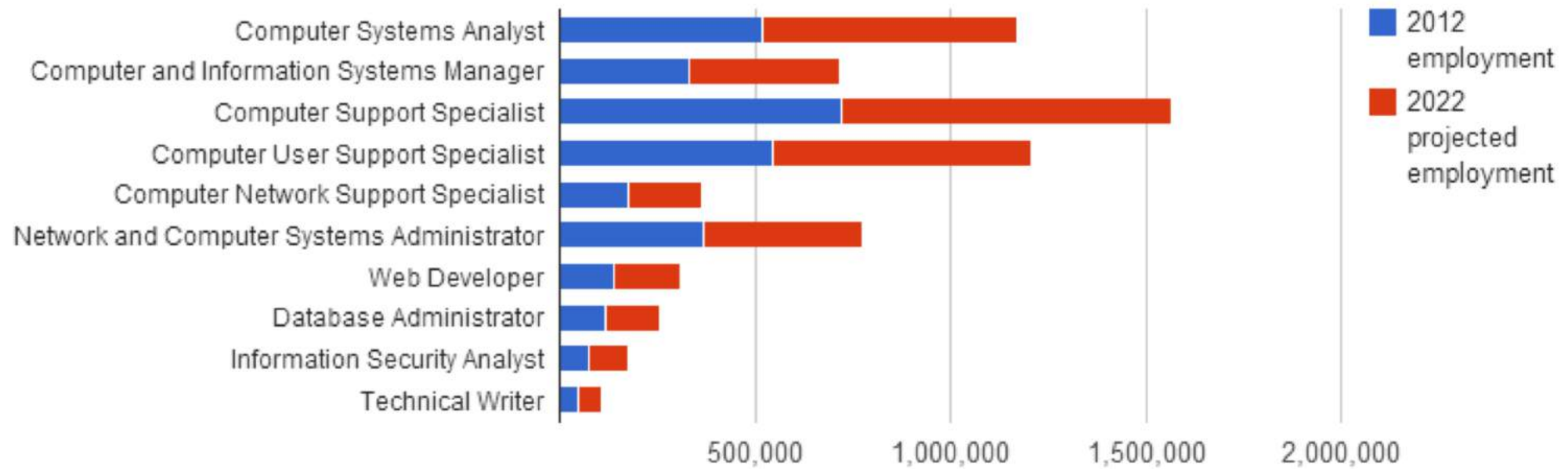
What is ICT?

Degree Requirements – BS/BA ICT

120 Credit Hours Total

- 30 hours of General Education/UK Core
- 3 hours University Graduate Writing requirement: ICT 305
- 42 hours at the 300-level or above
- 2.00 cumulative GPA and 2.00 major GPA required to graduate

Pre-Major Requirements – 9 hours

- ICT 200 – Information Literacy & Critical Thinking
- ICT 201 – Personal Knowledge Management
- ICT 202 – Technologies for Information Services

Core Major Requirements – 12 hours

- ICT 205 – Issues in ICT Policy
- ICT 301 – Introduction to Databases
- ICT 305 – Data Detectives (GCCR)
- ICT 596 – Internship in ICT

Information Studies Track – 18 hours

Cognate – 15 hours (300+ level) outside the major

Free Electives – 6 hours (300+ level)

Transferred Hours – 60 credit hours

Offered every semester, including summer!



Transfer Credit

UK will accept credits from 100-level or higher course taken at regionally accredited institutions in which a D- or higher was earned

- Maximum of 67 credits accepted from a 2-year institution (unlimited from 4 year)
- Regardless of number of transfer credits UK may accept, all candidates for undergraduate degrees must complete 30 of the last 36 hours of their program at UK

Core Courses – 15 hours

- ICT 600 – ICT in Society
- ICT 610 – Research Methods in ICT
- ICT 650 – Intro to Leadership in Information Professions
- ICT 661 – Intro to Data Science
- ICT 596 – Practicum

Elective Courses – 21 Credit Hours

Elective courses dive further into the three concentration tracks: health; technology and analytics; policy and regulation

Your Educational Benefits

How the Employee Education Program (EEP) works:

The Employee Education Program (EEP) only applies to UK employees attending UK. Employees must follow admission and registration procedures and deadlines established by the University Senate. Be aware of fee and payment deadlines and fee assessment when courses are changed. An [EEP Form \(for UK employees\)](#) must be turned into the Benefits office, 112 Scovell Hall, 0064, by the deadline established. Please check online or with the Benefits office for the most current EEP forms available each semester. Only one course may be taken during work hours with approval by your supervisor and department head. You must make up your missed time within the same work week, which may include taking only a half-hour lunch break or changing your starting and/or ending times. Exception for more than 6 hours can be given to UK employees attending UK.

What the Employee Education Program (EEP) covers:

Please be aware that the Employee Education Program waives tuition (activity fees only for UK employees attending UK). Any other fees (course and/or program fees), books or expenses related to the class are the employee's responsibility. Graduate-level waivers in excess of \$5,250 per calendar year are subject to tax as mandated by IRS Section 127.
