Lung Cancer Screening Programs and Community Partnership Opportunities

- What opportunities exist for <u>LCS programs</u> to get started with engaging in community partnerships?
 - First, find out if your hospital or health system has outreach staff and connect with them.
 - Next, connect with your KCP RCCS https://www.kcp.uky.edu/about/to who have many connections within local community networks across the state.
 - Co-organize community events and/or worksite wellness events to promote lung cancer screening through educational exhibits and coordinate on-site sign ups
 - KCP RCCS an provide technical assistance to providers to facilitate tailoring messaging to reach target populations
 - KCP RCCS are trained in using data resources that are community and area development district specific to help target LCS outreach efforts
- How can <u>other types of organizations</u> on the call contribute to LCS outreach efforts?
 - Depends on role
 - FQHCs and other primary care: make sure connected to local LCS programs and how to refer to them; find out if they have options for uninsured patients to get screened
 - Community orgs: can printed brochures from KCP that describe eligibility requirements and that people should talk to their primary care; for uninsured people they can direct them to local FQHCs
 - Ky-nectors in each district can help uninsured people applying for Medicaid or other insurance programs
 - o KY Cancer Link is a patient navigation organization that can be a helpful resource
 - o Can get involved in community events mentioned above
- What are **some examples** of community partners that focus on populations experiencing health inequities?
 - Regional RCCS can connect with specific organizations in local community, such as: food pantries, faith-based councils or church leaders, community action agencies, community centers, Salvation Army, recovery centers and programs, FRYSCs
 - Appalachia/rural very community-specific so RCCS can make connections, including county or regional health coalitions
 - African American outreach such as:
