9 Steps to

Step 1: Education

Never Stop Learning: Life-long learning is your keyword.

- Accept New Challenges
- Skill Updates
- Become a Nursing Expert (i.e., IABP, IV, etc.)
- Staff Development Offerings



Step 1: Education (cont)

- Higher Degrees (completing your BSN, going back for your MSN, DNP or Ph.D.
- Start to Plan Educational Goals <u>Now</u>
- Specialty National Certification(s)
 - CCRN
 - CNOR
 - -CEN
 - Just to name a few









Benefits of Certification

Why become certified?

- Validation of nurse's cognitive knowledge and continued competency in their specialty area
- Improved patient outcomes
- Displays a commitment to personal and professional development
- Raises the professional standard of nursing

How does UKHC support nurses achieving their certification?

- UKHC will pay the certification examination fees
- UKHC will pay the recertification fees
- Able to earn points for the NPA Clinical Ladder (i.e., Bronze, Silver, Gold, Platinum)

Step 2: Ask, Listen And Learn

A good listener can learn a lot.

- Keep Your Ears and Mind Open
- Ask Questions
- Shadow, obtain a Mentor









Step 3: Fulfill Your Current Job

Your current job might be best place to start your career planning.

- Expand Your Skills While Working or Volunteering
- Join a Committees, Councils, Task Forces (if they don't exist....create one!!)









Step 3: Fulfill Your Current Job

- Valued Employees Strengthen their Unit, Floor, Organization
- Example One of My RN's that wants to be a PCM....is assisting with budgeting, scheduling, shadowing, etc.







Step 4: Keep Building Your Network Your next career step might be right under your nose in your network.

- Network
- Build Your Contacts
- Shadow
- Informational Interviews
- Alumnus/Former Faculty
- Utilize the Career Center







Step 5: Identify Your Current Job

Your current job should be identified, not assumed.

- Make sure you don't work with tasks you assume are important. This is waste of time and talent.
- Schedule regular 1:1 meetings; have a list of goals; ask for clarification, etc.





Step 5: Identify Your Current Job

- Clarify Role
- Ask for <u>additional</u> responsibilities including joining a Council, working on your NPA, Precepting, Charge, Be part of the solution, not the problem, etc.
- Set Goals

• 1:1 Meetings, Evaluations, etc.







Professional Development for Nurses

Professional development is

the process of improving nursing practice by continuing education and training. It **can** also involve attending continuing education opportunities that bring us up to date on the latest technology, techniques, and ways to practice. ...



Common Professional Development Goals for Nurses

Some of the more common professional development goals that nurses set for themselves are:

- Acquire advanced technology skills.
- Maintain continuing education unit (CEU) requirements.
- Get involved in Evidence based research.
- Improve job performance; increase duties and responsibilities.
- Refine interpersonal skills.
- Hone specific skill set to mastery/expert level (i.e., Super User)
- Obtain leadership roles (i.e., Chair, Precepting, Unit Charge, Committees, Councils, etc).
- ¹⁸• Obtain **professional** certifications.



Opportunities for Professional Development: UK Nursing Professional Advancement (NPA) Core Requirements

Bronze Level * \$1. 00 hour * 16 hours external PL * No conference money

- Core Requirements Distribution of Points
- Nursing Experience + Nursing Education (Tool #1):
- 3 years RN experience + Diploma
- 3 years RN experience + ADN
- 2 years RN experience + BSN
- 2 years RN experience + MSN or BSN + MHA, MPH, MSOM or MBA
- 2 years RN experience + DNP
- 2 years RN experience + BSN+ PhD in Nursing, Business Administration,
- Public Health or Education
- Note: 3+ years of LPN experience can be used in lieu of 1 year of RN
- experience. Please see Glossary of Terms for more details.
- Professional Contribution (Tool #2):
- Current involvement on at least one (1) unit, service line, hospital, or
- enterprise level council or committee Minimum of 5 points Efficiency: 1 point Quality and Safety: 1 point Service Excellence: 1 point Professional Development: 1 point Additional point(s) from any category listed above: 1 point

- Enrolling in a RN to BSN, MSN, DNP or Ph.D. program is more challenging.










Step 8: Pick The Right Tools

Career Planning Exercise

Identify one professional goal

(e.g., Review your job desc, update your resume, LIT, etc.)

One educational goal

(e.g., Begin exploring educational programs (RN to BSN, MSN, DNP, etc.), attend a Lunch and Learn, Staff Development Course, etc.)

- One professional activity goal (e.g., Bronze level, Journal Club, Committee, Task Force, Volunteer, etc.)
- One professional career planning goal

(e.g., Obtain letters for graduate school, develop a Portfolio or "Brag" Book, etc.)





Professional Goal Examples:

- To complete orientation
- To obtain and review my job description with my Patient Care Manager or Assistant Patient Care Manager
- To meet with Sue Strup in the UKHealthcare Career Center to update my resume or cover letter or to develop a Curriculum Vitae (CV) for graduate school applications
- Meet with the UK Writing Specialist (Whitney Kurtz-Ogilvie) to develop a Personal Statement for graduate school applications
- To participate in the Leaders in Training Seminar Series. Kathy Isaacs, RN, Ph.D. (kathy.isaacs@uky.edu) applications July 2021
- To begin exploring various Nursing Certifications and to begin working toward completion (i.e., CCRN, CEN, etc.)
- Obtain advanced credentialing such as PALS, ACLS, ECMO, BCLS, etc.
- Other?



Educational Goal Examples:

- To pass the EKG class
- Complete ECCOs
- To begin exploring various RN-BSN, MSN or DNP/Ph.D. nursing programs and the various UK Tuition options including Employee Education Program (EEP) or the Nursing Tuition Contract
- Attend the next UKHC Nursing Education Fair November 5, 2020 at 11 a.m – 2 p.m. PAV A where you can meet 20+ nursing programs including MSN, BSN, DNP and Ph.D.
- Attend and record Staff development offerings
- Shadow an APRN, Nurse Educator, Nurse Midwife, Clinical Nurse Specialist (CNS), Nurse Informaticist, Nurse Leader, Platinum RN, etc.
- Find out if you will need to take the GRE or MAT for graduate school
- Apply to various nursing graduate programs or to RN to BSN programs
- Other?



Professional Activity Goal Examples:

- Work one week of night shift
- Explore obtaining the bronze, silver, gold or platinum level professional development
- Join or start a Journal Club on your unit/floor; or take the lead on one of the Monthly Journal Articles and Discussions
- Join a Committee, Task Force, etc.
- Precept a new RN or a Nursing Student; take the Preceptor Class
- Participate in a community volunteer activity such as Mission Lexington, Surgery on Sunday or Refuge Clinic, to name a few
- Take your Residency Project and write and get a paper published or conference abstract submitted
- Develop a research project and submit an abstract for Nursing Research Day
- Develop a <u>Patient Education Tool</u>
- Other?



Professional Career Planning Goal Examples:

- Challenge yourself by improving a weakness such as public speaking, presentations, computer skills, Zoom, etc. by taking a class or joining a Club such as Toast Masters (for public speaking)
- Begin thinking about whom you would ask to write letters of recommendation for a promotion, graduate school, etc.
- Start collecting your letters of support from patients, mentors, PCM's, etc. that mention your nursing abilities for your *Professional Portfolio*
- Collect any awards, recognitions, etc.
- Other ideas?




