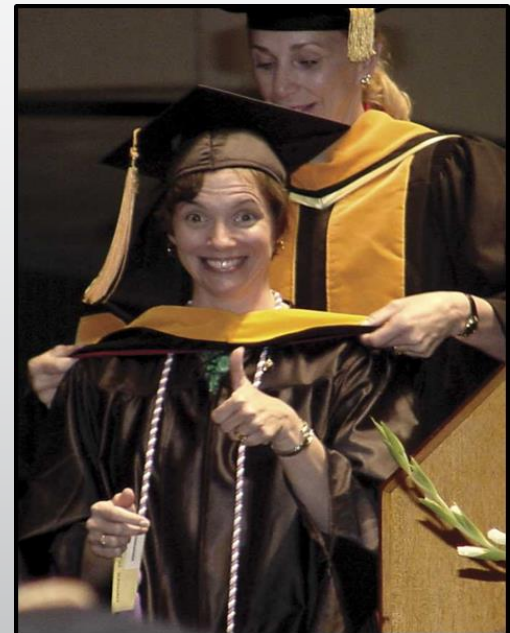

Nurse Anesthesia BSN to DNP

The University of Cincinnati Nurse Anesthesia BSN to DNP program requires 36 months (nine semesters) of full-time study. Clinical experience begins in the third semester to allow students to integrate and apply concepts learned in the classroom



Nurse Anesthesia BSN to DNP

Program Admission Requirements:

- Non-restricted RN license from any state
- Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree from an ACEN (formerly NLNAC) or CCNE accredited school of nursing
- Minimum one year of full-time critical care experience as an RN within the past three years.
- Current CCRN Certification
- Current American Heart Association ACLS Provider Certification
- Science GPA of 3.0 or higher on 4.0 scale
- GRE score of 150 or higher for Verbal Reasoning preferred
- GRE score of 150 or higher on Quantitative Reasoning preferred
- Personal interview with Nurse Anesthesia Admissions Committee

Application deadline is February 15, 2015

interviews will be held March 16-17, 2015

- 74-110 credit house, specialty dependent
- 8-9 full time semesters
- Nurse Anesthesia, Pediatric Primary & Acute Care NP, Adult/Gero Primary Care NP, FNP, Nursing Administration
- GRE required

Post MSN-DNP

- 42 Credit hours
- 14 classes, 4 full time semesters
- 504 practicum hours, project based
- No GRE if GPA is over 3.25

PhD

BSN-to-PhD

- Requires a minimum of 90 hours of course work including the dissertation
- Requires 2 semesters of graduate coursework tailored to your interest prior to entry into PhD courses
